Two races down and Stainland Lions are riding high in the Yorkshire Veterans (YVAA) league. Impressive performances from Gav Mulholland, Mark Pottinger and Richard Hand, see Stainland Lions men heading the leader boards across all three competition categories. Stainland's three musketeers are the leading male runners, holding off competition from Horsforth's Neil Burton and Rich Allen of Pudsey Pacers. Anne Johnson of Stainland heads the women's top five runners with 196/200 points.

Kirkstall's race saw Stainland women taking three out of the top five ladies' places.. Tanya Seager led them home with Mags Beever and Anne Johnson taking the third and fifth places. There is strong competition across the Ladies divisions. Horsforth lead in two with Stainland taking the 'top 4' category. Pudsey and Holmfirth are close behind suggesting that this competition is going to be taken to the wire.

With the Summer running season well under way Lions went far and wide this week. Rachel Cullen and Gav Dodd continued their impressive half marathon performances, finishing the Edinburgh Half in 1:30.40 and 1:39.45 respectively - a(nother) new PB for Cullen.

Ed Hyland came seventh in this years' Apperley Bridge Canter (10k), closely followed by Sean Thompson and Mark Preston.

Rebecca O'Neill had a good weekend with strong finishes in two 10k races, breaking the 50minute barrier at Melmerby.

Just nine weeks after giving birth , Lucy Collins was the fifth lady home in the awesome Pen Y Ghent fell race. Climbing 1650 ft over a 5.5mile course, the race attracted fell runners from across the north and was ultimately won by Tom Adams of Ilkley Harriers in 45.41; with Victoria Wilkinson of Bingley taking the Ladies prize. However her 49.41 result was challenged by the next four ladies. Collins was just over a minute behind and only 45 seconds separated the second and fifth placed runners. Tackling a particularly slippery downhill resulted in Collins coming home minus the sole of one of her fell shoes! Stainland's Jonathan Collins was 27th out of a field of 139, coming home in 55.27.

In Whitby a contingent of Lions added to the points in the latest Yorkshire Veterans Race.

Aileen Baldwin and David Roberts both took prizes in this tough 6 mile trail race on a hot day. Aileen took the F60 category with a strong 52.51 run which saw her as the sixth lady to finish. Roberts 43.30 result placed him ninth in the men's results and winning the M50 category. They were supported by Lorraine Naylor (9th) 53.11, Helen Hudson (10th) 53.24, Carol Lord (32nd) 69.58. Men Paul Patrick (40th) 52.06, Dave Hudson (57th) 57.47 and Alan Gibson (70th) 66.37.

Overall after three races Stainland Ladies top the 'four to count' category, with Horsforth leading in the other two, while the outcome in the Men's tables see Stainland topping the two main team categories.

By far the largest turnout of the weekend was saved for the Bolton Brow Burner. Taking in Sowerby Bridge, Copley, Greetland and Norland, all the race fees go to support local schools on the run. As a Stainland Championship race it attracted a large part of the club keen to garner points from a mix of trail and road which took in Copley Hill, Rochdale Road and a downhill back to the Copley data centre. Tanya Seager was forced into third place overall by strong competition. Overall winner was Debele Tesfaye, the Bradfordbased Ethiopian who is smashing records far and wide and who's coach is tipping him to be the next Mo Farah. His 37.04 run was off his 10k personal best of 29.55 but reflected the trail conditions.

Joe Crosfield of Calder Valley came second in 38.17 with Seager taking the first lady title in 39.35 - very close to her 2014 10k PB of 39.04. Lions took five of the top 10 places in a field of 147 which ultimately saw 45 Lions compete.

Finally Rachel Cullen took the first lady title at the Goole Riverbank, completing the 9mile race in 1.03.
